STAGING

Position the Crowd and People on the left side of the stage, the Narrators in the center, and the Leader and Demetrius on the right side of the stage.

SCRIPT

Narrator #1: Paul had been teaching in the city of Ephesus for a couple of years—

Narrator #2: That's long sermon!

Narrator #1: He healed many people...

Narrator #2: Ta-da!

Narrator #1: And everyone I the are heard about Jesus, and was amazed—

Narrator #2: That's amazing!

Narrator #1: People admitted their wrongs and burned their books of magic—

Narrator #2: --in one gigantic campfire.

Narrator #1: While all this was going on,

Narrator #2: A silversmith named Demetrius god upset.

Demetrius: I don't like this Paul guy one little bit!

Narrator #1: You see, Demetrius made lots of money selling little silver statues of a made-up goddess named Artimes.

Demetrius: No one is gonna buy my little statues anymore!

Narrator #2: So he gathered his friends and coworkers.

Demetrius: My friends!

People: (Together) Yes!

Demetrius: We make lots of money, don't we?

People: (Together) Oh, yeah!

Demetrius: But now Paul is telling people that his God is the best, right?

People: (Together) Right!

Demetrius: And lots of people are believing him, right

People: (Together) Right!

Demetrius: And people might stop coming to worship our goddess, right?

People: (Together) Right...

People: (Together) Artemis of Ephesus is the great goddess! Artemis of Ephesus is the great goddess!

Narrator #1: Some people were yelling one thing...

Person #1: ONE THING!

Narrator #1: And others were yelling something else...

Person #2: Boogie, floogie, ma-googie!

Narrator #1: I said they were yelling something else.

Person #2: I know. And "boogie, floogie, ma-googie" is something else!

Narrator #1: I'll say...Anyway, most of the people there didn't even know what was going on!

People: (Together) We don't know what's going on!

Narrator #2: But the friends of Demetrius kept right on yelling—

People: (Together) Artemis of Ephesus is the great goddess! Artemis of Ephesus is the great goddess!

Narrator #1: The whole town was there. Everything was getting out of control.

Narrator #2: Until, finally a man name Alexander went up on stage—

People: (Together) Boo! Boo!

Narrator #1: He held up his hand for everyone to be quiet—

People: (Together) Boo! Boo!

Narrator #2: But it didn't work.

People: (Together) Boo! Boo!

Narrator #1: Because the people saw he was a Jew, just like Paul, and they kept yelling over and over---

Narrator #2: So, finally, everyone went home.

Narrator #1: Whew.

Narrator #2: No kidding...and when it was all done, Paul encouraged the believers.

Narrator #1: He said, "Don't be upset; God is with you. He loves you and will take care of you!"

Narrator #2: Aha...aha...we see what you mean...

Narrator #1: Paul said good bye to his friends.

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Narrator #2: Then Paul went to another city to share the good news of Jesus with them.

Everyone: (Together) The End!

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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Why was Demetrius so upset?
- What was he trying to do when he spoke to the crowds of people?
- How did God use the Leader to calm the crowd down?
- What did Paul do after the angry crowd went home?

- *Tell the account of the Riot in Ephesus from Acts 19 in simple story form or read it from a children's bible.*
- *Ask 2-3 of the simpler discussion questions.*

Narrador 2: Eso es increíble!

CRAFT

OBJECTIVE: WHIMSICAL YARN HEARTS

Make colorful heart mobile

MATERIALS PROVIDED BY EM

- Scissors, staplers, hole punches

DIRECTIONS

- Draw a large heart on the cardboard
- Draw a smaller heart inside the large heart
- Cut out the hearts so that you have a large heart with an empty center.
- Tape one end of yarn to the heart and begin winding it around the heart. Change colors along the way.
- When yarn is covering entire heart tie or tape the end down
- Tie string or ribbon to the top
- Make several and attach by string (optional)

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

- Cereal box type cardboard (several per child)
- Yarn of various colors
- String or ribbon
- Tape

SIMPLIFIED CRAFT OPTIONS

- Use thick or fluffy yarn for easier coverage of the cardboard
- Use variegated yarn instead of switching yarn colors

OBJECTIVE: QUESTION CONTEST

Listen to the question. Run to the “yes” or “no” chair to score points for your team

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

- You will need to find 2 chairs on location
- List of prepared questions

DIRECTIONS

- Divide kids into two equal groups
- Have teams sit in a row on the ground so that the two teams are facing each other about 4 feet apart
- Assign a number to each child, assign the same numbers to each team so that 1's sit across from each other, 2's sit across from each other, etc.
- Place an empty chair on each end of the row of kids, designate one to be the “yes” chair and one to be “no”
- Ask a question that can be answered “yes” or “no” then call out a number.
- Players with the correct number races to the correct chair. First player to sit in the correct chair scores a point for their team.

SAMPLE QUESTIONS

- Did Dimetrius make stone statues?
- Is it good to worship a goddess?
- Is the sky blue?
- Is the bible true?
- Is your hair purple?
- Do books swim?
