BIG IDEA

In this skit both the doctor and the patient are being foolish. The doctor knows that Bob really needs Surgery (Jesus) but is unwilling to spend the time to help Bob. Bob, in the end, is more concerned about his social appearance than his health (salvation).

• PREPARATION & MATERIALS •

BIBLE LESSON

- Cast: Doc (a white coat and stethoscope would be nice, but not necessary), Bob (Just an average patient)
- Setting/Props: Two chairs if available.
 Throughout most of the sketch the doctor is standing. Only sitting to drive a point home.

GAME

- Cotton balls
- Small items to create two identical obstacle courses

CRAFT

- White paper pre-cut 4x6 inches, or index cards (20 per child)
- File folders pre-cut to 4x6 inch rectangles, get a variety of colors and patterns (2 per child)
- Markers, crayons, stickers, etc for decorating

long, and I'd have to cut into your chest, and your stay in the hospital would definitely disrupt your lifestyle. No, I'll just keep giving you locals to keep out the pain; you won't

know the difference.

Bob: Won't know the difference, I have a tumor on my heart that is going to kill me and

you're saying that I won't know the difference, I'll be dead!!

Doc: Don't worry, it could be years before it kills you, besides, tumors are relative, they

effect people in different ways.

Bob: No not really, I don't want people pitying me, or thinking I'm not healthy. You really can just keep giving me something for the pain.

Doc: Well it might grow too big to deal with, but that's rare. More than likely it will just stay right where it is.

Bob: Well thanks Doc, I'm glad you set me straight. Even if this thing is going to kill me, I sure don't want people knowing that I have it. I can deal with a little pain if every body thinks I'm OK.

Doc: Now you're talking sense. Well, I'm late for a game. (goes out swinging)

Bob: (gathers his stuff) And to think, I almost disrupted my lifestyle just for one little tumor. (gives a half laugh and walks out)

- What is Bob most concerned about, his health or his appearance to his friends?
- Do people ever put their friend's opinion higher than their need for Jesus?
- What would you do if you were the doctor?
- What would you do if you were Bob?

CRAFT

OBJECTIVE: JOURNALS

Kids will make personal journals to record their own thoughts, prayer requests, memory verses and drawings

DIRECTIONS

- Stack 5 sheets of paper at a time, punch holes 2-3 inches apart along the short side
- Continue punching holes until you have 20 pieces of white paper and two pieces of file folder
- Line up holes and run metal rings through holes
- Decorate with markers, crayons or stickers

MATERIALS PROVIDED BY EM

• Scissors, hole punches, staplers

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

- White paper pre-cut 4x6 inches, or index cards (20 per child)
- File folder pre-cut to 4x6 inch rectangles, get a variety of colors and patterns (2 per child)
- Markers, crayons, stickers, etc for decorating

OBJECTIVE: COTTON BALL COURSE

Kids try to blow a cotton ball through an obstacle course.

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

- Cotton balls
- Small items to create two identical obstacle courses

INSTRUCTIONS

- Separate children into 2 teams.
- Set up identical obstacle courses on two tables
- Teams take turns sending players to blow their cotton ball through the course
- After successfully navigating the course players run back and tag the next three players
- First team to send their entire team wins.
