There was a professor of philosophy who was a deeply committed atheist. An atheist is a person who does not believe in the existence of God. His primary goal for one required class was to spend the entire year proving that God couldn't exist. His students were always afraid to argue with him because of his impeccable logic. Sure, some had argued in class at times, but no one had ever really gone against him because of his reputation. At the end of every semester on the last day, he would say to his class of 300 students, "If there is anyone here who still believes in God, stand up!"

In twenty years, no one had ever stood up. They knew what he was going to do next. He would say, "Because anyone who believes in God is a fool. If God existed, he could stop this piece of chalk from breaking when it hit the ground. Such a simple task to prove that He is God, and yet He can't do it."

And every year, he would drop the chalk onto the tile floor of the classroom, and it would shatter into a hundred pieces. All of the students would do nothing but stop and stare. Most of the students thought that God couldn't exist. Certainly, a number of Christians had slipped through, but for 20 years, they had been too afraid to stand up.

Well, a few years ago there was a freshman who happened to enroll. He was a Christian and had heard the stories about his professor. He was required to take the class for his major, and he was afraid. But for three months that semester, he prayed every morning that he would have the courage to stand up no matter what the professor said or what the class thought. Nothing they said could ever shatter his faith...he hoped.

Finally, the day came. The professor said, "If there is anyone here who still believes in God, stand up!" The professor and the class of 300 people looked at him, shocked, as he stood up at the back of the classroom.

The professor shouted, "You FOOL!!! If God existed, he would keep this piece of chalk from breaking when it hit the ground!"

He proceeded to drop the chalk, but as he did, it slipped out of his fingers, off his shirt cuff, onto the pleat of his pants, down his leg, and off his shoe. As it hit the ground, it simply rolled away unbroken. The professor's jaw dropped as he stared at the chalk. He looked up at the young man and then ran out of the lecture hall.

The young man who had stood proceeded to walk to the front of the room and shared his faith in Jesus for the next half hour. 300 students stayed and listened as he told of God's love for them and of His power through Jesus.

OBJECTIVE: CONFIDENCE PIZZA

Kids will make a paper pizza topped with qualities others notice about them and they enjoy about themselves.

DIRECTIONS

- Color sides of paper plate yellow and brown like pizza crust.
- Kids write qualities they enjoy about themselves on the red pepperoni circles.
- Kids write qualities they enjoy about a friend on brown sausage pieces for their friend's pizza.
- Team leaders write qualities they enjoy about the kids on green pepper pieces for everyone's pizzas.

SIMPLIFIED CRAFT OPTIONS

- Pre-cut pizza toppings
- Make a list of qualities on a large sheet of paper (ie. fast runner, neat writing, big smile, cheerful, good humor, helpful, kind, etc.)

MATERIALS PROVIDED BY EM

- Scissors

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

- Paper plates
- Red construction paper cut into 1 1/2 inch pepperoni circles.
- Brown construction paper cut into 1 inch bumpy ground sausage shapes.
- Green construction paper cut into 1/2 inch green pepper strips.

OBJECTIVE: GET INTO GROUPS

The Grouping Game helps teach kids to notice things about their peers.

MATERIALS BROUGHT BY TEAM

No materials needed for this game.

INSTRUCTIONS

- All of the players except the person who is "it" close their eyes and stand in a group.
- The person who is "it" gently guides each player to a part of the room based on a common characteristic, such as hair color.
- Once all the children are put into a group, they open their eyes and try to identify how they are grouped.

GAME OPTIONS

- Choose some of the younger kids or more quiet, introverted kids to be "it" in this game.
- Add a game of tag or a relay race to burn off energy.
